1. What is your full name, and where do you reside? (Give State, County and Postoffice.)
Salina Kiser, reside in Carter County Ky Grayson Post office
2. How long and since when have you been a resident of this State? Fifty years continuously
3. When and where were you born and what was your maiden name? In Letcher County Ky name Salina Childers
4. When and where was your husband born—state his full name, and when and where were you and he married, and who performed the marriage ceremony. (A copy of the marriage license, or affidavits of two or more persons who know when the applicant was married to her husband, must accompany the application.) In Russel County Virginia, Fullen Kiser, married in Carter County Ky P B Hord performed Ceremony
5. When and where and in what Company and Regiment did your husband enlist or serve during the war between the States? In Russel County Virginia in Co A # 22 + 7 Virginia Cavalry
6. How long did your husband serve in said Company and Regiment?
7. When and where did your husband's Company and Regiment surrender?
8. Was your husband present at the time and place when his Company and Regiment surrendered?
9. If not with his command at surrender, state clearly and specifically where he was, when he left command, for what cause and by what authority?
10. When and where did your husband die? Sept 20th 1919 in Carter County Ky
11. At the time of your husband's death, were you living with him as his lawful wife? yes
12. Have you married since the death of your soldier husband? No
13. What property, real or personal, or income do you have or possess, and its gross value? Land worth about \$352 one cow two Hogs worth about \$70 no income
14. Have you a family? If so, who compose such family? yes Myself and Grand Son who is 15 years old
15. Name some friend, giving his name and postoffice address, who will be willing to have us write to him about your case if necessary Jeff Kiser, Post office Grayson Ky

been presented as a witness in support of the application of Mrs. *Salina Kiser* for a pension under Confederate Pension Law, approved March 11, 1912, after being duly sworn, true answers to make to the following questions, deposes and answers as follows:

1. What is your name and what is your postoffice address? *Margaret Gaudill*

Post office Grayson Kentucky

2. Are you acquainted with the applicant, Mrs. *Salina Kiser* *yes*

If so, how long have you known her? *ever since 1869*

3. Where does she reside, and how long and since when has she been a resident of this State? *Resides*

in Barter county Ky Fifty years or thereabouts

4. Were you ever acquainted with her husband? *yes*

5. Were either or both of you present at the marriage? *I was present at the Marriage*

which occurred in Barter Co Ky in 1869 or 1870 or 1871

6. How long did you know him? *I think fifty years or more*

7. When and where did enlist in the war between the

States, and in what Company and Regiment did he enlist, and how do you know this?

8. Were you a member of the same Company and Regiment at the close of the war?

9. How long did he perform regular military duty?

10. When and where was his Company and Regiment surrendered?

11. Were you with the command when it surrendered?

12. Was, the husband of applicant, present?

13. If not present, where was he?

14. When and where did he leave his command?

For what cause?

By whose authority did he leave?

How do you know all this? (State fully and clearly) *by seeing, personal contact, established usage, established rumor, or custom*

15. When and where did *Fullen Kiser* die? *on*
Sept 20th 1919 in Barter County Kentucky

16. Where did he reside at his death, and how long had he been a resident of Kentucky at his death?

17. Do you know of your own knowledge that applicant is the lawful widow of *Fullen Kiser*

- Note—1. Before any questions are answered, the Clerk or Notary shall swear applicant and the witnesses in the following words: "You do solemnly swear that you will true answers make to each of the questions asked of you, and the evidence you shall give will be the whole truth; so help you God."
- 2. Additional affidavits may be attached, if blank spaces are insufficient.
- 3. All affidavits must be made before an officer using a seal.
- 4. Only widows who were the wives of soldiers need apply—and are now widows. Those married since Jan. 1st, 1890, not entitled.
- 5. Two witnesses are necessary to make out claims.
- 6. Attach certified copy marriage license in every case, or certificate of County Court Clerk, under seal, that license is filed in his office duly certified by officiating minister, or the affidavit of the officiating minister, or the affidavit of a witness of the ceremony, or the affidavit of two witnesses who knew them as man and wife, prior to January 1, 1890, and knew that they were living together on the date of his death.

NOTICE TO APPLICANTS

The Widows' Pension Law, passed by the Kentucky Legislature, provides for the widows of *soldiers only*, and they must have been residents of the State of Kentucky since January 1, 1907.

Widow must have married prior to 1890.

To be eligible the applicant must have remained a widow after the death of her soldier husband, and must be indigent.

Read the questions in the application carefully and answer them fully.

Read the law, and unless you come clearly under the laws it will be useless to file application.

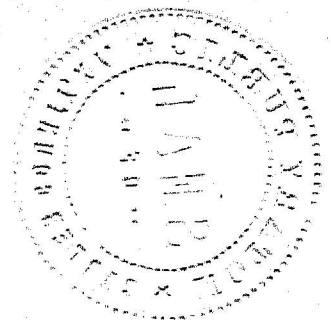

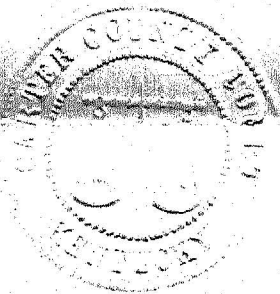

My dear Sir:

Your letter relative to the pension claim of Mrs. Selina Kiser received. Our records show Mrs. Kiser's pension was granted December, 12th, 1919- and on February 15th, she received a check for \$19.60 which was the amount due her from December 12th, 1919 to February 1st, 1920- she also received a check for \$36.00 mailed 1920- which was the amount due for that quarter. She has been paid regularly, as our records show, and there is no amount due her.
