

Soldier's Application for Pension

I, James N. J. Sadler

am a citizen of Kentucky, resident at Nippie in the County of Johnson

in said State of Kentucky, and was a soldier from the State of Virginia, in the war between

the United States and the Confederate States and I do hereby apply for aid under the Act of the General Assembly of

Kentucky, entitled "An Act granting pension to disabled and indigent Confederate soldiers." And I do solemnly swear

that I was a member of Co. H. 34th Va. Cavalry

in the service of the Confederate States, and that by reason of disability and indigence I am now entitled to receive the benefit of this Act. I further swear that I do not receive aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States, and that I am not an inmate of any soldier's home, and that I am unable to earn a reasonable support for myself and family. I do further solemnly swear that the answers given to the following questions are true:

J. W. T. Sadler, Nippa, Johnson County, Ky., the applicant herein.

That he is 67 years of age and enrolled in the Confederate army in the year 1862 and served during the war; that he has lived on Toms Creek in this County for a period of 18 years; that he is not able to earn a support by manual labor; that he has some personal property; that he has no profession by which to earn his support; that his main support is dependent on his little boy and what he and his wife can do; that his net income is not over \$200.00 per annum; that the total value of real estate of himself and wife is about three or four hundred dollars; that he has no contract for his support; that he was born in the year 1834; enlisted in Virginia; has been a citizen of this County since 1867.
